



ABOUT KHIE ...

The Kentucky Health Information Exchange (KHIE), housed at the Cabinet for Health and Family Services (CHFS), is a secure, interoperable electronic network that supports statewide exchange of patient health information among healthcare providers across the Commonwealth.

KHIE HISTORY & STATEWIDE EXCHANGE

The first pilot hospital was connected to KHIE in April 2010, while statewide rollout began in January 2011 and continues to grow across the Commonwealth. The pilot participants included six hospitals and one clinic.

Using KHIE technology, participating providers can access, locate, and share needed patient health information with other providers at the point of care.

Participating providers can utilize KHIE's Community Record (virtual health record) to access needed patient health information to facilitate care coordination. In addition, providers can also use KHIE's Health Information Service Provider (HISP) to route Direct secure messages for transitions of care and Meaningful Use efforts.

One of the most valuable aspects of the HIE is its Medicaid claims data. The health information exchange is seeded with five years of Medicaid claims data. KHIE receives a nightly deposit of Medicaid claims data—ultimately enriching the HIE experience and constructing a more robust HIE for the state of Kentucky.

CONNECTIONS WITH KHIE

- As of March 9, 2015, KHIE has signed 739 participation agreements, which represents 2,800 locations.
- KHIE has a total of 1,033 provider locations submitting live data and actively exchanging information.
- Additionally, 90% of acute care hospitals are live on KHIE and 372 providers or points of care are live with Direct Secure Messaging.
- KHIE averages over 250,000 patient queries per week.
