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

Event Notifications Overview





Overview

Partnering with KHIE to receive medical event notifications about a patient's specific medical encounter can keep providers 'in the know' as their patients transition from various healthcare settings back to the practice. The use of Event Notifications supports care coordination activities across disparate providers to inform healthcare providers when a patient is admitted to or discharged from an Emergency Department, for example.

Bulk upload allows authorized users to submit a patient panel for a large volume of patients through a single excel sheet. This feature allows easier monitoring of patients with the same notification needs, such as diabetes patients.

Event Notifications Generated In 2023

Solution

KHIE supports multiple channels to send Event Notifications to Participants. Supported channels include **Direct Secure Emails, API FHIR, and the ePartnerViewer**. These methods provide interoperable means of engaging and utilizing critical health care information at the point of care.

Monitoring Bariatric Patients - ePartnerViewer Use Case



Ephraim McDowell Regional Medical Center leveraged the Kentucky Health Information Exchange (KHIE) to enhance patient outcomes and improve resource management. KHIE facilitated effective patient monitoring and transfer management, ensuring continuity of care and optimizing resource utilization amidst rapid patient turnover.

Objectives

Ephraim McDowell Regional Medical Center implemented a program to monitor all bariatric patients for a 2-year period, post- procedure.

Challenges:

- Some patients develop complications (e.g., fail to absorb nutrients), requiring readmission for IV support.
- The continuum of care is impacted for patients who are transferred because of severe illness.

Solutions

KHIE's ePartnerViewer and Event Notifications Service emerged as valuable tools for the hospital.



The **ePartnerViewer** offered hospital clinicians an efficient way to gather information related to their bariatric patients from one source to inform post-procedure progress as well as recent health status.



The **Event Notifications** were set up to provide real-time updates (1) when a bariatric patient was admitted to another healthcare organization or (2) when a patient was treated for any complications related to the bariatric procedure.

Benefits

Improved Patient Care



KHIE Event Notifications improved patient care and care coordination by providing an efficient way of informing clinicians of specific events occurring with their bariatric patients, post-procedure.

Enhanced Interoperability



KHIE's ePartnerViewer and Event Notifications provide specific details about events occurring at other healthcare organizations; this information can be quickly shared with relevant providers.

Increased Efficiency and Resource Utilization



Access to clinical data in the ePartnerViewer and the delivery of Event Notifications considerably reduced the time and staff needed to monitor bariatric patients.

Leveraging Event Notifications to Support Child Welfare Workers



Review

Many youth in foster care have complex traumatic histories, leading to more intensive physical and behavioral health care and psychosocial service needs than other youth receiving Medicaid services. Traditionally, health-related data is not easily nor seamlessly shared between or accessed by providers or service workers.

Overview


KHIE collaborated with TWIST, a program within Kentucky's Department for Medicaid Services. TWIST, the child welfare information system, is managed by Medicaid's Department for Community Based Services (DCBS). The alliance provided DCBS case managers the functionality to receive event notifications for their foster care caseloads. With these notifications, the case workers know when foster children on their caseload are moving within the various healthcare settings.

Impact

39,354 Event Notifications were sent to TWIST through the KHIDS integration in 2023:
